| Description Some of the DCMTK command line tools use a log message on FATAL level when an input file could not be loaded or an output file could not be written. Other tools use the ERROR level for the same purpose. It would be nice to have a more consistent use of logs levels in the command line tools (but also in the underlying library, of course). Background of this feature request: when using a command line tool with option --quiet, only FATAL log messages are shown. | | | |
